

This London zebra crossing is no castle or cathedral but, thanks to the Beatles and a 10-minute photoshoot one August morning in 1969, it has just as strong a 5as any to be seen as part of our heritage.
This is obviously an unusual case and, although a modest structure, the crossing has international 6. and continues to possess huge cultural pull - the temptation to recreate that iconic 1969 album cover remains as strong as ever.
