## DRIVING PHRASAL VERBS











Buckle up

Fasten your seat belt in a car, plane etc.

E.g. Please buckle up now; we're about to land.

Cut off

**Block someone's way** 



E.g. A second policeman cut off his escape.



Drive by Do something out of a car

E.g. He was killed in a drive-by shooting.

**Get out of** = Leave

E.g. You must not get out of the car when it is in motion.





Slow down

To decrease speed; to go slower

E.g. Slow down! You're driving too fast.

Pull over

Stop on the side of the road

E.g. She saw the ambulance coming up behind her and pulled over.





Pull in

Move to the side of the road

E.g. We pulled in at the side of the road.
