Exercise 1

<p>some</p>  <p>Use some in <i>positive</i> sentences:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I'm going to buy some clothes. • There's some ice in the fridge. • We did some exercises. 	<p>any</p>  <p>Use any in <i>negative</i> sentences:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I'm not going to buy any clothes. • There isn't any orange juice in the fridge. • We didn't do any exercises.

B any and some in questions

In most questions (but not all) we use **any**:

- Is there **any** ice in the fridge?
- Has he got **any** friends?
- Do you need **any** help?

We normally use **some** (*not any*) when we *offer* things (**Would you like ... ?**):

- A: Would you like **some** coffee?
- B: Yes, please.

or when we *ask for* things (**Can I have ... ? etc.**):

- A: Can I have **some** soup, please?
- B: Yes. Help yourself.
- A: Can you lend me **some** money?
- B: Sure. How much do you need?



not (n't) + any

- There aren't **any** cars in the car park.
- Sally and Steve haven't got **any** children.
- You can have some coffee but I don't want **any**.

no + noun (no cars / no garden etc.)

no ... = not + any or not + a:

- There are **no cars** in the car park. (= there aren't **any** cars)
- We've got **no coffee**. (= we haven't got **any** coffee)
- It's a nice house but there's **no garden**. (= there isn't **a** garden)

There aren't **any** cars } in the car park.
There are **no** cars }
